

HOW TO USE RAVELRY LIKE A PRO – CLASS OUTLINE

Let's take a quick look at your profile

- Click on your profile in the upper right-hand corner
- Would you like to add a photo? Add your state? Your birthdate?
- You can change your Ravelry name 3 times.

#1 First things first – choose your mode; it's a personal preference

- Click on your photo box in the far upper right-hand corner; yours may be an empty box
- A drop-down box will appear, click on Mode – light background or darker background or black background.


#2 Traditional Front page – let's take a look at the top of the page headers.

- patterns
- yarns (search for any yarn)
- community (People; Friends; Groups)
- support (yarn, mini mart; help; contact)
- advanced search – Ravelry's Best Feature
-  messages
-  forums and posts
- (NOTE: I have a pro on my page – Designer's business tab)



#3 Click the Ravelry logo - this is like the front page of a newspaper for Ravelry.

- Thursday Tip
- Eye Candy
- Scroll down to January 7, 2022, post – Interesting Facts about Ravelry.



#4 Click on Patterns

- Hot Right Now
 - Top 5 patterns on Ravelry are showing; at the bottom of the box: click on Top 20; or Browse patterns in this order
- Debut Patterns – first time a designer has published a pattern

#5 Let's look at some viewing options for patterns

Click on Patterns

- Type in Search: Friendship Road Sweater
- Click on the pattern
- You can view Results as:
 - Small cards, tall cards; OR Large photos – it's your preference and you can switch back and forth
- Now Scroll down to Cookieladyknits; she has and
- Now click on JanRachel; this means helpful!
- Let's say you're knitting this pattern and you don't understand something.
- Go to Filter: All Helpful Projects – and you can see if other knitter's notes will help you with your problem


5.5 Question: I like a pattern but don't know what yarn to use?


- Click on Yarn Ideas! This is all of the yarn that knitters have used to make this particular project
- Look at the mint green boxes underneath – you own that yarn

#6 Advanced Search options

- Click on Patterns
- Underneath the empty text box in small print – click on “or use advanced search”




- A drop-down box will pop up on the left-hand side of the screen (you may have to click on the small arrows above filter your search, see below) – now you can scroll down



- Click on any filters you might want to use: Craft; Category; Availability; has photo; attributes; age/size/fit; weight.
- Sooooo many ways to find what you want.
- Now look at the top of the advanced search page.

#7 How to block a designer – (in a nice way)

- You can block a designer from popping up in your Ravelry search.
- Maybe you're just not a fan of a designer's aesthetic . . .
- Go to the three dots in the after the pattern name and click on “hide this designer.”




#8 Click on Yarns

- By company, fiber content, weight, name.
- Check out the Road Trip Planner.


#9 Question: I have yarn but don't know what to use it for?

- Click on the yarn you have – EX: Let's search Malabrigo Rios
- Click on Projects – way too many right?

- Go back to Malabrigo Rios yarn page
- Click on Buying Options – where can you get this yarn?
- Scroll all the way down to the bottom of the page – buy it from a knitter!
- On the Malabrigo Rios yarn page click on the colorway Cereza
- Look at all of the boxes – will someone sell you theirs? Leftovers?

#10 Click on Community – then Groups

- Join and leave groups as you please; if there's an interest – there's a group; from cooks to books and from socks to TV shows
- Join the local Knitter's Guild group (Minnesota presents Yarnover each fall)

#11 How to interact with Ravelry threads easy and fast

- Search and Click on Irocknits Group – join it
- At the bottom of each post there are several options for you to click - it's an easy way to participate without having to type to respond – especially inside of No Chatter threads



#12 What if you mistype something in the thread (or how to edit)?

- Click the three dots in the bottom right-hand corner for a dropdown of options: Reply, Edit, Delete, Flag post.

#13 How to post a finished object in a Ravelry Thread?

- See handout (step by step instructions are given).

#14 What is a no chatter thread?

- A group wants to have no talking interactions so that it will only be posts to qualify for a prize – then they can use a random number generator to choose a winner.

#15 Click on Community – then Friends:

- Friend Activity (what have they finished lately)
- Friends Blogs
- Friends
- Neighbors (who likes the same projects that you like) - Click on neighbors
- Organize

#16 Where is “MY” stuff?

- Click on your photo – upper right-hand corner. (a drop-down menu will appear)
- Your settings.
- Your purchases.

#17 How do I get messages?

- Click on Messages. (middle of the headings top of the page)
 - Email and blocking.
 -

#18 Click on Notebook

- This is your personal space, which includes: your Projects, Your Stash, Your Queue etc.

#19 Projects

- Under Notebook.
- Click on Projects.
- Sort projects by . . . Recently finished; WIPS; recent first; happiness; favorites; weight; color; most yardage first; least yardage first.
- Filter projects by . . .
- View projects as . . .

#20 Queue (things I want to knit someday)

- How to things get in my queue – click on add to queue on the pattern page (upper right-hand corner).
- How to reorder your Ravelry queue
 - Click on queue.
 - Click on the 1 2 3 on the right-hand side next to the photo.
 - A new screen will appear.
 - Click on a circle to reorder the current item.

#21 Make a Wish List of patterns

- Go to a pattern you would like.
- Put it in your queue.
- Underneath the Pattern Title Name in your queue will be a small box:  Include this Ravelry Download on my wish list (that means you'd like this pattern).
- You can also gift patterns to people on Ravelry from their wish list.

#22 Stash

- Click on My Notebook
- Click on Stash
- Sort stash by . . . Name; date added; purchase date
- View stash as Thumbnails, large photos, list; you can print/export your stash
- Filter your stash . . . Weight, yarn fiber type; color
 - EX: Do you have sport weight yarn in your stash?

#23 Other My Notebook drop-down choices

- Handspun
- Tools - Keep your needle inventory here
- Favorites (things that make me happy; inspired colors; I love this but might not ever knit it)
- Library - Post books and magazines – easy peasy

#24 How to post a project on your Ravelry page?

#25 How to post your stash to your Ravelry page?

- Go to my Notebook: Stash: Add stash
